End of Life



If you're using a Windows 10 machine, it's a good idea to start thinking about upgrading to Windows 11. Microsoft will officially end support for Windows 10 on October 14, 2025. After that date, your device will no longer receive important security updates, which are essential for protecting against viruses and malware.

Depending on your hardware, you may be able to upgrade to Windows 11 directly through Windows Update. If your device is compatible, just make sure to back up your important files before starting the upgrade process. Keep in mind:

- You can still use your Windows 10 machine after support ends, but it will be more vulnerable to security threats.
- Not all machines can be upgraded. If your device doesn't meet the requirements for Windows 11, you may need to purchase a new computer with Windows 11 pre-installed.

To stay current with updates:

- Type "update" in the search bar on your taskbar.
- Click "Check for updates" to make sure your system is up to date. While upgrading isn't mandatory, choosing not to upgrade leaves your device exposed to potential risks. Staying on a supported operating system is one of the best ways to keep your machine safe and running smoothly.



The Power of Prayer
