Internet vs Wifi

Many people confuse the internet with Wi-Fi, but they're not the same thing.

The Internet

- A global network of computers and servers that allows you to access websites, send emails, stream videos, and more.
- Your internet provider (like AT&T, Spectrum, Comporium, or Mid-Carolina) brings this connection into your home.

Wi-Fi

- A wireless technology that lets your devices (phones, tablets, laptops) connect to the internet without cables.
- It works through a Wi-Fi router, which sends signals to your devices.

How It Works at Home

- 1. Your internet provider installs a router that connects your home to the internet.
- 2. A Wi-Fi router (sometimes built into the same box) allows your devices to connect wirelessly.
- 3. If the internet goes down, your device may still show it's connected to Wi-Fi—but you won't be able to browse or stream because the Wi-Fi isn't connected to the internet.

Tip: Think of the internet as the road, and Wi-Fi as the car that gets you onto that road. You need both to reach your destination!
