New Laws & Updates for 2026

- **Solid Waste and Recycling**

- **Hands-Free Driving Enforcement**

(Feb. 28, 2026): Prohibits drivers from reading, composing, or transmitting any text, email, app interaction, or website interaction on a mobile electronic device. It also prohibits viewing movies, video games, or participating in video calls while driving. \$100 for a first offense

- **Short-Term Rentals:** Continued moratorium on new short-term rental permits in residential zones. Existing rentals can renew, but *no new permits are being issued*

Business license renewals begin February 2, 2026.

- **Liquor Liability & Tort Reform**

Venues that serve alcohol may be able to lower minimum coverage. Mandatory alcohol-server training is now required for those serving alcohol. Businesses will only be responsible for up to 50% of damages in drunk-driving lawsuits

- **Personal Privacy Protection Act**
Officers/judges can request removal of their home addresses, phone numbers, or certain property from government websites

- **SNAP Updates:** Benefits were updated Oct 1, 2025, and starting Aug 31, 2026, candy, energy drinks, soft drinks, and sweetened beverages are restricted
